

DRESS AND GROOMING CODE – Navarro Elementary School

Navarro Elementary School's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. It is applicable at school and school related activities. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

- A. Clothing must be worn that is neat and clean in appearance.
- B. Vulgar or obscene patches, medallions, slogans, advertisements for tobacco or alcohol, or insignia that may be offensive will not be worn. Likewise, any clothing that depicts Satanism, demons, violence, gangs, blood and gore, or death will not be allowed. Any article that is symbolic of membership in a gang or secret organization is forbidden.
- C. Hats and caps are not to be worn inside the building.
- D. All students shall wear shoes for health reasons. Wheeled shoes are not permitted. Sneakers are required for P.E. in order to prevent injuries. Students without sneakers will not participate in P.E. or recess. Students may leave a pair of sneakers in their cubby to change into as needed.
- E. Shorts, skirts, and skorts may be worn, provided they are of appropriate length, based on age and body size.
- F. Earrings, worn by girls, should not be long or make noise. Boys (PK – 6) at Navarro may not wear earrings during the school day.
- G. Any form of hairstyle, which is considered contrary to good hygiene, which is disruptive in appearance (i.e. Mohawks or designs shaved into the hair), or interferes with the purpose or conduct of the school, will not be permitted. Unnaturally colored hair is not allowed.
- H. Shirts must cover the stomach area. No backless shirts or spaghetti straps are allowed.
- I. Makeup and press-on nails are not allowed.
- J. Oversized clothing and clothing that is too tight may not be worn during school hours. Pants/shorts shall not "hang" below the waist or hip bones.
- K. No visible tattoos (including temporary ones).

The final decision on appropriateness in any case involving dress code questions rests with the campus administrator.

Any dress code violation may result in students being required to wear school-issued clothing during the school day.

DRESS AND GROOMING CODE - Navarro Intermediate School

Navarro Intermediate School's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. It is applicable at school and school related activities. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

- A. Clothing must be neat and clean in appearance free of holes, rips, frayed edges and tears.
- B. Vulgar or obscene patches, medallions, or insignia that may be offensive will not be worn. Signs, slogans, pictures advertising alcohol, illicit drugs, tobacco products, blood and gore, violence or sex (to include suggestive wording or pictures, gang related clothing and articles) may not be worn or displayed on backpacks.
- C. Appropriate under clothing will be worn and not exposed at anytime.
- D. Backless tops, see-through shirts or blouses, tank tops (less than 3 inches across), spaghetti straps, and strapless tops or dresses may not be worn. Clothing exposing the midriff is unacceptable. Necklines may not be lower than a line drawn from one armpit to the other.
- E. Shorts, skorts, dresses and skirts must be no more than 5" above the knee. No cut-offs shall be worn. The 5" rule is intended to serve as a guideline. Hemlines falling in this range are acceptable for school. The administration does not support the use of instructional time for measuring clothing. Please help us by not allowing your child to wear clothing that is clearly too short.
- F. Pajamas, pajama pants, or lounge pants are not acceptable.
- G. Hats and caps, headbands, hoods, and other head coverings are not to be worn in school buildings.
- H. Students must wear shoes. House shoes are not acceptable. . No wheeled shoes. Wear or bring tennis shoes for PE.
- I. Hair will be neat, well groomed, and of a natural color. Boys are expected to be clean-shaven. Hair styles that become a distraction are not acceptable.
- J. Nose rings or other body piercing will not be allowed. Earrings worn by girls should not be long or make noise. Boys (PK-6) may not wear earrings at school.
- K. Large, oversized clothing (If your shoes cannot be seen while standing still, the pants are oversized. If the pants are sagging down on your hips, they are oversized) will not be permitted. Pants and shorts are to fit at the waist and not sag on the hips.
- L. Chains on wallets, oversized belt buckles, large and sharp jewelry objects ("spiked" or otherwise) are not to be worn.
- M. Any other item(s) that cause a distraction and a disturbance may not be worn (sunglasses, etc.).
- N. No visible tattoos (including temporary ones). Body glitter and paint are not allowed.
- O. Safety pins of any size are not permitted and will be considered a dress code violation. If pins are holding clothing together, this clothing should not be worn to school. If safety pins are being used as decoration of clothing or backpacks, or worn as jewelry, they should be removed and not brought to school.

The final decision on appropriateness in any case involving dress code questions rests with the campus administrator.

Any dress code violation may result in students being required to wear school-issued clothing during the school day.

- A. **Clothing must be neat and clean in appearance free of holes, rips, frayed edges and tears.**
